



## **Garden Hill First Nation Travel Restriction Procedures**



No Unnecessary (cash paying/pleasure/leisure) Travel is allowed. All cash paying travel will stop on **Friday, September 4, 2020.**

All emergency situations will be considered for approval to travel to Winnipeg from Garden Hill First Nation. A list of emergency situations is listed on each of the forms.

All ***“Request for Travel Forms”*** must be completed along with a letter stating the reason why the individual is requesting to travel.

### **Leaving Garden Hill First Nation to Winnipeg.**

All “Request for Travel Forms” are available at GHFN Health Centre and at the health website: [www.ghfnhealth.com](http://www.ghfnhealth.com).

No Unnecessary (cash paying/pleasure/leisure) Travel is allowed.

Medical passengers do not need to submit a form, a travel warrant is good enough to give to Perimeter agent.

All forms must include letter stating REASON for leaving. Once approved, you will be given a “Permission for Travel to Winnipeg” form to give to the Perimeter agent.

It takes approximately two days to complete the travel process.

### **Leaving Winnipeg to Garden Hill First Nation.**

No Unnecessary (cash paying/pleasure/leisure) Travel is allowed.

Medical passengers do not need to submit a form.
